


Grade 2 Vocabulary Vegetables

"This vegetable is red and looks like an apple," said Sally.




"Tomato," said grandmother.

Sally clapped, and jumped for joy. "You are an expert in vegetables, granny," Sally said. Grandmother smiled happily.




